





REGULATORY CORNER

CHART 03 DOES EXEMPTION 45 CFR 46.104(d)(1) FOR EDUCATIONAL PRACTICES APPLY?

NOTE: This chart is consistent with the 2018 Requirements (i.e., the revised Common Rule). For use after January 20, 2019.



OHRP has posted on its website a set of decision charts that are consistent with the 2018 Requirements (i.e. the revised Common Rule). Titled, "Human Subject Regulations Decision Charts: 2018 Requirements," these graphic charts are intended to aid those who need to decide if an activity is research involving human subjects that must be reviewed by an institutional review board (IRB) and whether informed consent or the documentation of informed consent can be waived under the 2018 Requirements found for the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) at 45 CFR part 46, Subpart A. The 2018 Requirements were originally published on January 19, 2017 and further amended on January 22, 2018 and June 19, 2018.

The decision charts are necessarily generalizations and may not be specific enough for particular situations. The charts do not address requirements that may be imposed by other organizations, such as the Food and Drug Administration, the National Institutes of Health, other sponsors, or state or local governments.
